
### Nutrition Security

Weakens labor force


### **Oklahoma Landscape**


14.1% Overall Food Insecurity Rate12.1% Rural & 10.3% Urban

1 in 7 Households and1 in 5 Children face hunger

#### 134,000 Oklahomans

Likely eligible for grocery assistance but not utilizing Leaving **millions of dollars unclaimed** monthly

- Reloads monthly
- Puts money into local economy

\$1 in SNAP

\$1 in DUO Bucks (Up to 20/day)

On Qualifying Produce

*In the first year of evaluation:* 

**103%** increase in produce purchases with SNAP

**270%** increase when factoring in DUO

Overall, produce sales increased at a significantly higher rate than just DUO purchases





### Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children

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For pregnant, postpartum, and breastfeeding people & children <5



Works concurrently with SNAP, when eligible



Citizenship status not factored in determination



WIC offices in every county



#### Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations

- May be more accessible than SNAP retailers in rural locations
- Income similar to SNAP but cannot use at the same time





#### **Ranges for Assistance**

Nutrition Assistance can prevent Food Insecurity

#### ≤ 130% Federal Poverty Rate

- SNAP
- Free meals at school

≤ 185% Federal poverty rate

- WIC
- Reduced-price meals at school

Program qualifications vary. When in doubt, apply!

# Meals at School NSLP & SBP

- Improved academic performance
- Better behavioral outcomes
- Fewer referrals to nurse's or principal's office
- Higher attendance and graduation rates

#### **School Meal Forms:**

- All students encouraged to re-apply through their school each year
- Direct certification with
   SNAP and other programs



Impacts school funding and other programs like afterschool, summer, and universal free meals



### Who is Eligible?

Students who fall into **one** of the following categories:

- 1. Their household participates in SNAP, FDPIR, Medicaid, etc.
- 2. They meet household income eligibility requirements on the school meal form application
- They're enrolled at a school that provided free meals to all students, like through CEP

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
### **Afterschool Meals**

Provides no-cost meals and snacks to children and teens ages 18 and under

Boosts participation at afterschool programs

Operates after school, on weekends, and during holiday breaks

Located at schools, parks, libraries, community centers, etc.



### **Summer Meals**

All kids ages 18 and under can participate



Sites can offer up to two meals a day

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Helps prevent summer learning loss



Can be located at schools, parks, libraries, community centers, etc.



#### **Summer EBT** (Electronic Benefits Transfer)


