
Food Insecurity in Oklahoma

Oklahoma ranks 46th in food insecurity (America's Health Rankings, United Health Foundation)

Oklahoma ranks 49th in fruit and vegetable consumption (America's Health Rankings, United Health Foundation)


Nearly half of Oklahomans are struggling to pay regular expenses (U.S. Census Bureau Household Pulse Survey)

1 in 5 children in Oklahoma are food insecure (Feeding America) Share of households that lacked access to adequate food at some point in the year, 3-year averages


