



SUMMER MEALS

The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) is a U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) child nutrition program designed to ensure that children 18 and under have access to no-cost, healthy meals and snacks during summer break.

SFSP helps fill this hunger gap when school is not in session. In Oklahoma, the Oklahoma Department of Education administers the program and provides federal reimbursements to sponsors for every qualifying meal served. These reimbursements can help free up funds previously spent on food to serve additional children, hire staff, or provide more programming.

There are two ways to get involved - as a **sponsor** or as a **site**.



Sponsor Eligibility


- Public or private nonprofit organizations, faith-based organizations, school food authorities, or local government agencies
- Provide oversight to meal site(s)
- Communicate with the state agency
- Submit claims for all qualified meals and snacks served



Site Eligibility

- Schools, libraries, community centers, parks, apartment complexes, faith-based organizations, Boys & Girls Clubs, or YMCAs
- Be located in a school attendance area where at least 50 percent of students are eligible for free and reduced-price lunch
