ABAWD	Able-Bodied Adult Without Dependents	A term that describes a person between the ages of 18 and 49 who has no dependents and is not disabled; must meet special work requirements to maintain SNAP eligibility
AoA	Administration on Aging	The federal Department of Health & Human Services division that administers the Elderly Nutrition Program; an ELD program
ВАТВ	Breakfast After the Bell	Students pick up breakfast from the cafeteria or a cart in the hallway on the way to their classroom or designated area to eat
BBCE	Broad Based Categorical Eligibility	A process where household can easily get SNAP benefits
BIC	Breakfast in the Classroom	A best practice model for school breakfast; ensures that kids get breakfast without the stigma a typical cafeteria breakfast, and avoids the issue of students missing breakfast due to bus schedules; an FNS/CNP/SBP Program; administered by OSDE
CACFP	Child and Adult Care Food Program	Provides nutritious meals to children and elderly individuals in daycare, homeless shelters and similar settings; an FNS/CNP Program; administered by OSDE
CACFP-At Risk		The component of CACFP that serves afterschool programs; an FNS/CNP/CACFP Program; administered by OSDE
СВРР	Center on Budget and Policy Priorities	A national nonpartisan research and policy institute in pursuit of federal and state policies designed both to reduce poverty and inequality.
CEP	Community Eligibility Provision	Term for a non-pricing service option for schools and school districts in low-income areas; administered by OSDE
CFSC	Childhood Food Security Coalition	A group of partner organizations that does summer meals; HFO helps organize
CNP	Child Nutrition Programs	An FNS Program
CNR	Child Nutrition Reauthorization	Term for process of federal reauthorization of child nutrition programs; happens every 5 years
CSFP	Commodity Supplemental Food Assistance Program	Makes commodity food available to supplement the diets of low- income pregnant and new mothers, infants, children up to age six and the elderly; an FNS/FDP Program
DUO	Double Up Oklahoma	HFO program that doubles SNAP purchases dollar for dollar for produce
FDP	Food Distribution Programs	An FNS Program
FDPIR	Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations	Provides commodity foods to low-income households, including the elderly, living on Indian reservations and to Native American families residing near reservations; an FNS/FDP Program
FFVP	Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program	Provides free fresh fruits and vegetables throughout the school day in elementary schools; an FNS/CNP Program
FINI	Food Insecurity Nutrition Incentive Grant Program	Grant program that supports projects to increase the purchase of fruits and vegetables among SNAP recipients by providing incentives at the point of purchase
FMNP	WIC Farmers' Market Nutrition Program	Provides vouchers for WIC recipients to redeem at participating Farmers' Markets; an FNS/WIC Program; administered by OSDH
FNS	Food and Nutrition Services	Department within USDA that manages the Federal Nutrition

FNS E&T	Employment and Training	Program that assists SNAP recipients with job readiness skills; an FNS/SNAP Program; administered by OKDHS
FRAC	Food Resource and Action Center	A leading national nonprofit organization working to eradicate poverty-related hunger and undernutrition in the United States.
FRPL	Free/Reduced Price Lunch	Part of the National School Lunch Program
MOW	Meals on Wheels	A national organization that provides nutritious meals and friendly, caring contact to elderly and disabled home bound individuals.
NAHO	National Anti-Hunger Organizations	A loose-knit coalition of organizations that have a national footprint
NKH	No Kid Hungry	A national campaign that connects kids to effective nutrition programs like school breakfast and summer meals; an SOS program
NSLP	National School Lunch Program	Provides low-cost or free nutritious lunch to children in school; an FNS/CNP Program
OHS	Oklahoma Human Services	Administers SNAP
OKCPS	Oklahoma City Public Schools	
OSDE	Oklahoma State Department of Education	Administers Child Nutrition Programs
OSDH	Oklahoma State Department of Health	Administers WIC (along with the Indian Tribal Organizations)
SBP	School Breakfast Program	Provides low-cost or free nutritious breakfast to children in school; an FNS/CNP Program; administered by OSDE
SFP	Summer Feeding Program	an FNS/CNP Program
SFSP	Summer Food Service Program	Provides free meals and snacks to children under age 18 when school is not in session; an FNS/CNP/SFP Program; administered by OSDE
SNAP	Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program	Enables low-income families to purchase nutritious food; formerly known as food stamps; an FNS Program ; <i>administered by OKDHS</i>
SNAP-Ed	SNAP Nutrition Education	Teaches SNAP recipients good nutrition and how to make their food dollars stretch further; formerly FSNE; an FNS/SNAP Program; administered by OKDHS
SOS	Share Our Strength	A national organization working to end childhood hunger in the United States.
SSO	Seamless Summer Option	Allows schools to streamline their meal services from the regular lunch program to summer meals; this decreases the amount of paperwork required but the reimbursement is lower; an FNS/CNP/SFP Program; administered by OSDE
TANF	Temporary Assistance for Needy Families	Designed to help needy families achieve self-sufficiency; states receive block grants to design and operate the program; formerly AFDC, or "welfare"; a U.S. Department of Health and Human Services program
TEFAP	The Emergency Food Assistance Program	Makes commodity food available to State agencies, which in turn distribute the food to non-profit community agencies which assist low-income persons; an FNS/FDP Program
